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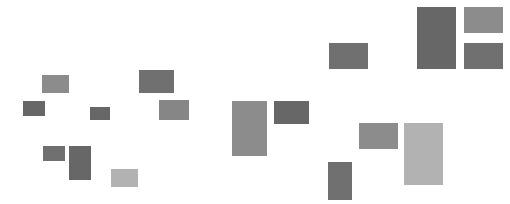
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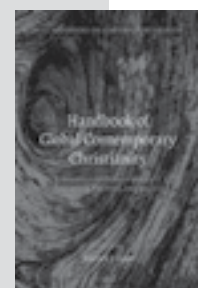




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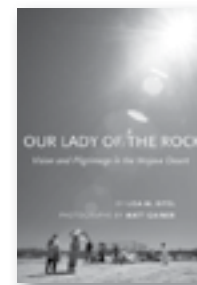
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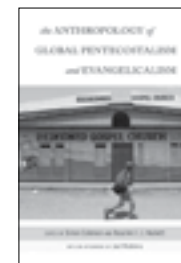
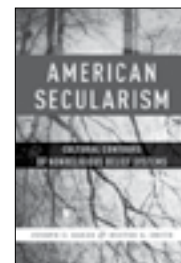
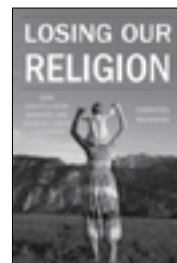
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Religion continues to be a force in public life—locally as well as internationally, across regions as well as cultures. To address the diverse public roles that religion can play in the contemporary world, we invite new assessments of religion in public life framed in comparative analyses—whether across religious and social groups, cultural settings, or nation-states. We particularly encourage proposals that place public religion in broader comparative perspectives, leveraging cross-national variation to develop concepts and test theories. But, of course, proposals for panels and papers on any topic in the scientific study of religion are welcome.

Potential topics related to the conference theme include studies of:

- how involvement (or lack of involvement) in public worship shapes individual attitudes and behavior
- the involvement of different religious groups, organizations, or institutions in the 2016 American presidential election
- the role of religion in shaping civic life across different religious or cultural groups, geographic regions, or nation-states
- the strength or weakness of religious political parties in North America, Europe, the Mideast, Asia, Latin America, and Africa;
- the impact of religious social movements on a range of issues, such as education policy, social service provision and human rights protection;
- the place of religion in constitutions and law, particularly putting prominent cases like the United States into comparative perspective;
- the impact of transnational forces on the public role of religion within particular states;
- the relationship between of economic development and public manifestations of religion; and
- the political or social meaning of secularism across regions, and the political impact of “secular” actors on the place of religion in public life.

All session and paper proposals must be submitted via the on-line submission system of the SSSR's web site, www.sssrweb.org, which opens February 2, 2016. A session proposal requires: 1) session proposer's full contact information; 2) a session title; and 3) an abstract of not more than 150 words describing the goal of the session and how the session will contribute to the scientific knowledge of religion. Individual paper proposals require the name(s) of the author(s), first author's full contact information, an abstract of not more than 150 words that succinctly describes the question(s) motivating the research, the data and methods used, and what the paper expects to contribute to the knowledge or understanding of religion.

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Papers and sessions may address the conference theme by focusing on topics such as:

- In what ways are American congregations (and congregants) exceptional, according to cross-national Congregational Life Survey data?
- How do unaffiliated Americans compare with unaffiliated people elsewhere?
- In what ways are Americans exceptional in how they use their time and resources for religious causes?
- How do secularization processes differ in the United States and Europe?
- How does the practice of minority religions in the United States compare with the practice of those religions in countries in which their adherents are a majority of the population?
- The U.S. and India are each home to the largest global population of a major religion as well as thriving minority groups. What can we learn from comparing religion in each country?
- How does the religious marketplace in China compare with the landscape in the U.S.?
- As Catholic hegemony erodes in Latin America, to what extent is religion in the region moving toward the U.S. model?
- As Africa develops economically, are religious commitment levels starting to converge with those in the United States?
- How is religion in Japan similar to or totally different from religion in the U.S.?
- Are new religious movements disproportionately born in the U.S.? If so, why?
- How do findings about the relationship between religion and health in the United States compare to those in other countries?
- Why do Americans seem more concerned about the religious commitments of their leaders than people in other advanced economies?
- How have American models changed the practice of religion elsewhere? How have foreign models changed the practice of religion in the United States?
- What do qualitative studies reveal about differences between the practice of religion in the United States and elsewhere?
- How do online manifestations of religion vary between the United States and other countries?
- How is the concept and study of religion different outside the United States?
- Are there different relationships between race, socioeconomic status and religion in the United States versus elsewhere and how are these differences consequential?
- How do the relationships between religion and family formation in the United States compare with those found elsewhere?
- To what extent does the scientific study of religion focus on the United States? Is this a problem? What kind of change can we expect in the future?

Papers and sessions addressing the conference theme are particularly welcome. Other papers that reflect the focus of the RRA will be considered. The RRA seeks to unite academic and religious professionals working at the intersection of research and practical religious activities.
